

SAP Trainer Geoff Wright is bright spark rebuilding Haiti

2/3/2010 Fresh from teaching a SAP Overview course at Olas, SAP trainer Geoff Wright jets out to beleaguered Haiti on a mission with the charity “Haven Partnership” www.havenpartnership.com.

On the 25th of April 2010, 250 volunteers will travel to Haiti to build homes, community facilities and hope for some of the poorest people in the western hemisphere. Geoff, who was once an electrician will be wiring-up some new-built houses and other dwellings, with supplies sourced locally and supervising local people who will be paid to help on the project.

To take part, volunteers like Geoff are required to raise a minimum of €4,000. Approximately €2,000 of this covers flights, accommodation, food and water for the duration of Build it Week. The remainder of the funds raised will go towards building materials for the houses that you will build during Build it Week.

Volunteers will live on site in basic accommodation, and will take part in all activities that go into the running of the camp as well as the construction of the new homes: roofing, plumbing, painting, medical, catering, water distribution, etc. With your help, Haven will build 300 houses across Haiti this year.
